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MISSION STATEMENT

The aim of athletics in the Skyland Conference will be to develop wholesome attitudes toward school programs, teams, participants, officials, administrators and coaches; to develop the qualities of loyalty, unselfishness, responsibility, cooperation, citizenship, leadership and sportsmanship; to compete successfully in a sportsmanlike manner and to encourage the growth of morale, health, and self-discipline of all student athletes.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I

NAME

Section I: The organization shall be known as the Skyland Conference comprised of up to four divisions: Delaware, Raritan, Valley, and Mountain.

ARTICLE II

MEMBERSHIP

Section I: Part A: The membership of this Conference shall be limited to public and private high schools.

Part B: Accepted members of the Conference include the following:

Section II: Part A: Any qualified school may apply for admission to the Conference by submitting a formal written request to the secretary. A qualified school is defined as one that sponsors a minimum of one (1) boys' and one (1) girls' Conference sport in each of three (3) recognized sports seasons as defined by the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association. Member schools must agree to participate within their division in all sports they sponsor (unless waived by the membership).

Part B: Application to the Conference must be approved by a **two-thirds** (2/3) vote of the **entire** membership. Membership changes must be approved by a **two-thirds** (2/3) vote of the membership and submitted one school year in advance.

Section III: Part A: Each member school shall have **one** (1) vote cast at all meetings. In the event a school is not present at a meeting where a vote is to be recorded the school **must** call the Secretary of the Conference to record their vote.

Part B: A majority vote shall carry any motion except as otherwise provided in this constitution.

ARTICLE III

ADMINISTRATION

Section I: All member schools must approve the Constitution and By-Laws of the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association and Skyland Conference

Section II: The Executive Committee will consist of the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer.

Section III: The officers of the Conference shall be President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Scheduler. Compensation for the officers shall be as follows to be paid in two installments of 50% each: Dec 1 and May 1 (approved December 9, 2015):

President: \$1,300.00	Secretary: \$1,500.00
Vice President: \$700.00	Scheduler: \$800.00

Miscellaneous Expenses for standard operating procedures for officers, i.e. mailing, mileage, copying, etc. to be paid on September 1 and February 1: President - \$1,000 and Secretary \$500.00

Section IV: The officers of the Conference shall be elected at the June meeting and hold office for a two-year term. (2012) Officers may succeed themselves. A Nomination Committee will be appointed at the April meeting by the President and shall consist of three members who will present a slate of officers at the May meeting for a June vote.

Section V: The President shall preside at all meetings of the Conference, he/she shall call meetings of the Conference whenever a majority of the members shall request him/her to do so, or, whenever in his/her judgment, the good of the Conference demands it.

Section VI: The Vice President shall assume the duties of the President in his/her absence. In the absence of the President and the Vice President the Secretary shall assume the duties of the President.

Section VII: The Treasurer shall collect and have charge of the funds of the Conference and shall pay all authorized bills. Annually, all accounts must be audited.

Section VIII: The Secretary shall keep minutes of all meetings and shall conduct all necessary correspondence, including notification to all members of all meetings.

Section IX: The Scheduler/Scheduling Committee shall be responsible for providing Conference schedules for all member schools.

ARTICLE IV

PROTESTS, VIOLATIONS, PENALTIES AND APPEALS

Section I: Any member school violating a rule or regulation or basic standard of accepted conduct of the Conference and/or NJSIAA Constitution shall be obligated to report the detailed specifics of the incident in writing to the Conference and/or NJSIAA with a copy to the President and Secretary of the Conference within three (3) school days from the occurrence of the alleged violation(s).

Section II: When any violation, controversy, or misunderstanding arises, the schools involved **must** make all attempts to resolve the issue between themselves. The League President and Secretary are to be informed of all action taken by the schools to resolve the matter.

Section III: If this approach does not resolve the issue, a committee will be convened by the League President upon receipt of a formal request from either of the schools involved. The official request for a hearing must be in writing, signed by both the Principal and Director of Athletics and must be made by no later than ten (10) school days after the date on which the action, controversy, or misunderstanding occurred. The President shall appoint three (3) members of the Conference from schools **not** involved in the controversy under review, to serve as the committee. The committee, which must always include the President, a Principal, and a Director of Athletics, is to meet within five (5) school days after appointment by the President to hear testimony presented from the schools involved in the matter under review. At the conclusion of this meeting, the committee, after due deliberation, will present a written report and written recommendations to the schools involved in the controversy within seven (7) days of the hearing.

Section IV: The schools involved are empowered to accept or reject the “finding” and/or the recommendations of the committee. If one or more of the schools involved in the dispute does not agree with the findings and/or recommendations presented by the committee, that school, or schools may petition for a hearing before an Appeals Committee as appointed by the President within three (3) school days of the request. The final decision on any, and all, disputes or controversies will affect the member schools. Therefore, all member schools must be kept informed.

Section V: The nature of violation will dictate the following penalties:

1. Letter of Censure – directed to a coach and school by the President sent to the Principal and Superintendent of the member schools involved and with the Principal/Director of Athletics required to report to the Conference any action taken to prevent a recurrence of the said violation.
2. Probationary Status – loss of right to play home athletic contests for a designated period of time, plus a written plan for preventing future incidents of a similar nature.
3. Removal from the Conference resulting from a series of incidents of very severe violations of conduct or of the rules and regulations of the Conference. This request shall be effective upon the vote of a **two-thirds** (2/3) majority of the Conference.
4. Forfeiture of contest.

ARTICLE V

STANDING COMMITTEES

Section I: Scheduling, Realignment, Assignors, Constitution Review, Medical Advisory, Sportsmanship, Historian and Technology.

ARTICLE VI

SCHEDULING

Section I: The Scheduling Committee will create divisional schedules based on the approved Divisional Realignment Committee recommendations.

Section II: Member schools **must** fulfill their assigned Conference schedules unless mutually agreed upon.

ARTICLE VII

MEETINGS

Section I: The Conference shall meet in regular session each month. The meeting dates will be established at the June meeting.

Section II: A quorum for the purpose of conducting official meetings of the Conference shall consist of two-thirds (2/3) of the member schools.

Section III: All member schools should be represented at all meetings. If a Director of Athletics finds it impossible for his school to be represented at a Conference meeting, he/she **MUST** inform the President and Secretary by phone prior to the meeting and make every attempt to send a representative. If a quorum should not be present due to the absence of representatives, the President or Secretary shall then inform all schools of the postponed meeting.

Section IV: **All new business brought before the Conference must be presented by a member school in writing at least one week prior to the scheduled Conference meeting to the President or Secretary.**

Section V: When the Conference is without the services of the Secretary a member school shall be appointed by the President to take meeting minutes.

ARTICLE VIII

FEES

Section I: Annual dues of \$1,750.00 shall be assessed to each member school payable to the Treasurer prior to November 1. Entry fees/assessments are based on participation of member schools.

ARTICLE IX

AMENDMENT

Section I: The Constitution and/or By-Laws must be amended by a **two-third** (2/3) vote by the member schools.

Section II: Constitutional changes must be presented to the membership. Changes are to be acted upon following Robert's Rules of Order.

ARTICLE X

ORDER OF BUSINESS

Section I: The order of business at a regularly scheduled Conference meeting shall be as follows:

- H. Adjournment

ARTICLE XI

ROBERT'S RULES

Section I: The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the Conference in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws of the Conference.

ARTICLE XII

ELIGIBILITY

Section I: Each member school shall abide by the eligibility rules as set forth by the NJSIAA.

ARTICLE XIII

GENERAL

Section I: The Constitution and By-Laws shall be adopted by the member schools on a yearly basis.

ARTICLE XIV

DIVISIONAL ALIGNMENT/SCHEDULE CHANGE PROCEDURE AND DIVISIONAL ALIGNMENTS

Section I:

DIVISIONAL REALIGNMENT COMMITTEE

Divisional Change Procedure (effective June 2016):

Any proposal for changes to the present Skyland Conference Divisional Alignment for all sports must follow the procedures listed below:

1. A Coach, with AD approval, will complete the Conference Divisional Realignment survey/form. The form is on the Skyland Conference website under “AD Stuff”.
Fall submissions due – November 1, Winter submissions due – March 1, Spring submissions due – June 1, of the first year of the 2-year cycle.
2. Sports specific AD chair will share all *individual school* requests for divisional changes at the post-season meeting and ask for discussion and submit a summary of conversations no later than November 30 (Fall), March 30 (Winter), June 30 (Spring) of the first year of the 2-year cycle.
3. Sports specific AD chair will submit all requests with post-season meeting discussion summary to the Realignment Committee.
4. Schools that are out of alignment for enrollment purposes, and have received relief, will be identified and reviewed for each 2-year cycle.
5. The Realignment Committee will meet in July to consider all requests/proposals and make recommendations via email to the full membership one week prior to the August Athletic Directors meeting.
6. A vote of member schools on the Realignment Committee’s recommendations will be taken at the September Athletic Directors meeting, and a majority vote will render a decision on the recommendations. Athletic Directors who are not present for the September meeting may submit their vote to the League President or the Committee Chair prior to the meeting.
7. If the Realignment Committee’s proposals are approved, they will then be submitted to the Scheduling Committee to produce the scheduling matrix for the next 2-year scheduling cycle.

Delaware & Raritan Divisions - consist of all group 4 schools divided by enrollment (Watchung is closer to Franklin in terms of enrollment).

Valley Division - consists of all group 2 & 3 schools.

Mountain Division - consists of all group 1 schools.

Non-public schools will be placed within the 3 divisions based on their strength of program for each sport.

Division Guidelines:

- 1 Division - 1-9 teams
- 2 Divisions - 10-14 teams
- 3 Divisions - 15-18 teams
- 4 Divisions - 19 or more teams

Alignment Guidelines:

The base alignment is 100% enrollment based, except for the non-publics. This is our “reset” or starting point for each realignment cycle. Once we have “reset” the divisions into our base alignment, we will follow the guidelines listed below. The final conference divisions will end up being around 90% enrollment based and around 10% strength of program based. Strength of program moves will be considered in the following situations listed below:

1. Placing non-publics in divisions
2. If the divisions need to be altered based on the number of schools in each division. Divisions do not need to have equal number of schools in them
3. The committee feels a program is grossly misplaced
4. A new program
5. Request for relief. **The request for relief will be highly scrutinized by the committee.**

Section III: The Skyland Conference Realignment Committee shall consist of the President and representatives of all divisions (two minimum).

Section IV: Any member school with a sponsored sport **MUST** compete in that sport with the other member schools in their division according to the rules and regulations of the Conference.

Section V: There must be a minimum of five (5) member schools sponsoring a sport for a championship to be determined.

Section VI: Championships will be awarded on a divisional basis determined by divisional competition and mandatory crossover when applicable.

Section VII: In determining division standings; (1) When assigned crossover games count for division title, then the team with the most number of wins (division & crossover) will be awarded the division title. (2) When crossover games do not count for division title, then the team with the most number of divisional wins will be awarded the division title. In the case of a tie in either number 1 or 2 above, head-to-head competition will serve as the only tie breaker. If head-to-head competition cannot break the tie, then co-championship (or multiple champions) will be declared.

Section VIII In the event that three (3) or more member schools tie for a championship, multiple championships will be declared.

SECTION III: AWARDS

Section I: The Conference shall present each school winning a divisional championship with an engraved plaque. The winning team of each Conference Tournament Championship will be awarded a team trophy saying "Skyland Conference Tournament Champions." Only the first place team will be awarded a team trophy plus individual medals.

Section II: In the event a multiple-championship is declared, multiple awards will be distributed.

Section III: The Conference will officially declare all championships. No award or trophy presented by any other organization will be sanctioned by the Conference.

Section IV: All Conference Certificates will be awarded to all first and second team selections as well as one honorable mention award per school per sport in each division. To be eligible for All Conference awards, your school must compete as a team in that particular sport. Competing as a team is defined by the competing program being included in the Conference scheduling matrix.

Section V: Any adjunct member school will not be eligible for Conference Championships. Any game vs. an adjunct member school regardless of the outcome **will not** be counted toward the division championship.

ARTICLE XVI

STRIKES

Section I: If a scheduled Conference contest cannot be played because of a Strike, it must result in a forfeit.

ARTICLE XVII

PROCEDURE IN THE EVENT OF LIGHTNING

Section I: Termination, or temporary suspension, must always take place when an electrical storm is imminent. The decision to terminate or suspend a game/meet/event when an electrical storm is imminent may be made by either the host school or the official. (NJSIAA Regulation)

ARTICLE XVIII

PROCEDURE – BEFORE A GAME IS TERMINATED

Section I: The host school management has full responsibility for determining whether or not conditions are such as to postpone or start a game/meet. Schools must know that once a game/meet/event has started, the official(s) have jurisdiction for terminating same prematurely.

TERMINATION, ONCE THE GAME HAS STARTED, IS NOT THE PEROGATIVE OF A COACH OR SCHOOL MANAGEMENT, AND THE ACTION OF REMOVING A TEAM FROM THE EVENT PRIOR TO THE CONCLUSION OF THE GAME/MEET/EVENT, REGARDLESS OF THE CIRCUMSTANCES, WILL RESULT IN SEVERE PUNITIVE ACTION BY THE NJSIAA CONTROVERSIES OR EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

- A. The following procedure should be implemented before termination of the event by the official(s).

1. Coaches and/or players should be penalized for misconduct as provided for in the playing rules;
2. Continued misconduct should result in the coach(es) of the teams being advised to correct the situation or be faced with possible termination of the game;
3. Officials should confer and, if they consider the circumstances warrant, teams should be directed to their respective bench areas while the Coaches, Athletic Directors, and Administrators of the school discuss an attempt to restore control of their teams and/or spectators;
4. When it is apparent to the game official(s) and the host school administration that to continue the event would present a clear and present danger to the safety and welfare of any party, the game should be terminated and the schools' head coaches advised accordingly. This should not be a unilateral decision; however, if the responsible parties are unable or unwilling to control their teams and/or spectators, the official(s) must inform the head coach(es) of the teams that the game is terminated;
5. Officials must not rule on forfeiture of any prematurely terminated events; only conferences and the NJSIAA have the jurisdiction to determine forfeits.

All games terminated due to control problems will require a comprehensive report to the NJSIAA Central Office and the Chapter Secretaries by the officials and the Principals of the involved schools. Said report from the officials should be forwarded immediately to the NJSIAA with a copy to the Principals of the involved schools. The report(s) will be forwarded to the League/Conference for a hearing prior to any action by the NJSIAA.

ARTICLE XIX**SKYLAND CONFERENCE “OFFICIALS” PROCEDURE
BEFORE A GAME IS TERMINATED**

The Skyland Conference has adopted the NJSIAA “procedures before a game is terminated” for all contests. The concern of the athletic administrators focus on inclement weather procedures. With that in mind, we have approved the following addition to the NJSIAA procedures.

Section I: Every attempt should be made to play each and every contest. In the event of an electrical storm, termination or temporary suspension must take place. In the event a contest must be interrupted because of rain/snow, there shall be at least one-half (1/2) hour waiting period before the game is terminated.

ARTICLE XX**MAKE UP PROCEDURE FOR POSTPONED GAMES**

Section I: All League games postponed from the originally scheduled dates must be rescheduled by mutual agreement with the exception of Football as per NJSIAA Regulations.

APPENDIX III

ASSIGNOR JOB DESCRIPTION

A. General Duties:

1. Develop a list of officials to work the Skyland Conference Varsity, Junior Varsity, Freshmen, County and State Tournament games as per the need of individual member schools.
2. Develop a personal communication system.
3. An annual stipend of \$350 for dual sport assigning and \$250 for single sport assigning will be paid for supplies, communication, and expenses to be paid at the conclusion of each season.
4. Assignor must return the contract received from Skyland Conference President indicating his/her intention to continue in the league assignor's position one month prior to the beginning of their season.
5. Assignor will be notified of confirmation or denial of duties at the conclusion of their season.

B. Before Season Duties:

1. Meet with coaches during the pre-season coaches meeting.
Stipend \$60.00

C. During Season Duties:

1. Communicate with Athletic Directors in a timely manner regarding changes, additions, and cancellations via telephone, fax, or e-mail.
2. Maintain high accessibility.

D. Assignor, School, Officials procedures for Schedule Cancellations, Postponements, Additions & Changes

1. Cancellations:
 - Assignor: The assignor will contact the school with the change. If the change is on the day of the contest, the assignor will contact the home school by phone.
 - School: The school is to inform the officials and assignor of any cancellations.
 - Official: If an official cannot fulfill an assignment, he/she must inform the assignor and school.

2. Postponements:
 - School: The school will inform the officials of the postponement. The school will then contact the assignor to inform him/her of the postponement, make-up date. The assignor will be responsible for assigning officials for the make-up date as needed. If officials cannot be reached, the school is to leave a voice mail or e-mail for the assigned officials informing them of the postponement and then contact the assignor.
3. Schedule Additions & Changes:
 - School: Request for assignments of officials for schedule additions and changes should be made at least 24 hours prior to the contest. The school is to contact the assignor. If the request is being made 24 hours prior to the event, the school should make phone contact with the assignor.
4. Payment of Officials:
 - If an official(s) is on site and a game is not played due to weather, opponent no show, or other circumstances a full fee is due.
5. Inclement Weather:
 - In case of inclement or threatening weather **assigned officials** are to contact the school prior to game time.

E. Compensation

1. Fees: Each assignor shall send each school an invoice and be paid one game fee per level assigned, unless otherwise approved by the Skyland Conference.
